THE MISSY TRAP – TO THE RESCUE AGAIN

Recently, a call came in from a concerned citizen about a dog wandering in an area rarely used this time of year. Fortunately, we had a valuable ally in a game warden who did some scouting for us. Despite the dog's evident fear and reluctance to approach, the warden was able to confirm its location.

The volunteer team made a plan and set to action, quickly setting up a small shelter with a little food to encourage the dog to stay in the area for the short term. When a dog is frightened, or in survival mode, it's not unusual for an animal who is otherwise friendly to consider humans a threat. That's where the Missy Trap comes in. It's a carefully crafted live trap that allows an otherwise "uncatchable" animal to get the help they need.

An experienced team of two people can set the Missy Trap up in about 30 minutes. Then some good, aromatic food is placed carefully to lure the dog into the trap. Our volunteers often do some special cooking for these situations, using liquid smoke or other items with a distinctive smell. The running joke, and it's undoubtedly true, is that the animals we're working to trap eat better than the volunteers! Once the trap is set, it's closely monitored by cameras connected to our volunteers' smartphones. Once the animal catches the smell of the food, they follow the food trail into the trap, and it is triggered to close. The trap's mechanism ensures that once an animal enters, it is securely contained without risk of getting harmed by moving parts or sharp edges.

Success with the Missy Trap is never guaranteed. Will the animal still be in the area? Will they take the bait? Our social media followers know that our efforts often have positive outcomes, and thankfully, this was no exception.

Because our team watches very carefully, once an animal enters the trap and is secure, the team is on their way to make a new friend! We want to get the animal out of the trap and to safety as

quickly as possible. Our volunteers brave the elements, offering enticing treats patiently working to gain the animal's trust. Luckily, we have incredibly talented, compassionate, and patient volunteers with a knack to do just that.

Our most recent save was a handsome Pitbull we named Gunnar. We don't know how he ended up where he did. We do know that his gentle nature and loving disposition leave us incredulous that anyone could abandon him. Unfortunately, we also know the reality is that it's a very real possibility that he was, indeed, left to fend for himself by the very people who once promised to care for him forever.



Gunnar is one of the fortunate ones; he's now in the care of a loving foster family, awaiting his forever home. Witnessing animals like Gunnar, who've endured neglect and mistreatment, learn to love and trust anew is amazing. It is what they so desperately want and what we are so eager to give!

The fastest trapping to date took all of two minutes! The Missy Trap is an amazing tool and our trapping

team uses it an average of one to three times per month.

Approach Dog



TNR: A CATALYST OF COMPASSION

Despite the constant flow of animals in need, we were able to place a significant emphasis on our Trap-Neuter-Release (TNR) program, successfully fixing approximately 100 cats in March alone.

Cats that go through TNR are fixed, vaccinated, and treated for fleas, ear mites, and any wounds they may have. Additionally, we tip an ear after they are fixed, making it easy to identify cats that have been through the program.

TNR isn't just about fixing cats; it's about making a lasting impact on their lives and our communities. By neutering and vaccinating them, we prevent countless kittens from being born into harsh environments and experiencing unnecessary suffering. This approach is humane, effective, and essential in tackling the root causes of cat overpopulation.




